High School Graduation Option B

High School Graduation Option B offers qualified students an alternate path to high school graduation. Students choose to simultaneously earn a high school diploma and a Wiregrass degree, diploma or two (2) Technical Certificates of Credit in a specific career pathway. High School Graduation Option B is only available for those students attending a public high school in Georgia.

Complete all required high school courses:

Requirements for students graduating in 2022 and beyond:

2 English/Language Arts (one of which must be American Lit and EOC)

2 Math (one of which must be Algebra I and EOC)

2 Sciences (one of which must be Biology and EOC)

2 Social Studies

1 Health/PE

Including all required Milestone/EOC Exams (Some of these courses may be taken through Dual Enrollment)

*Students enrolling in High School Graduation Option B are limited to 30 hours of Dual Enrollment Funding, just like traditional Dual Enrollment students. High School Graduation Option B students who max out their 30 hours of Dual Enrollment Funding may use the HOPE Grant and HOPE Career Grant to finish their diploma program, if eligible. All students who max out their 30 hours can choose to self-pay for additional courses. Students who use the HOPE Grant/HOPE Career Grant must meet HOPE residency requirements. Any HOPE Career Grant or HOPE Grant hours used will count against HOPE caps.
