# President's Message

## Dear Friends of Wiregrass,

This has been another banner year for Wiregrass. As we close out the academic year, our Dual Enrollment program was recognized for the highest enrollment in the state and we had an amazing twenty-one salutatorians and valedictorians in the graduating class of 2019. The 3,155 Dual Enrollment students are better prepared for the next step on their educational path and for employment. Wiregrass students and faculty shined at both state and national SkillsUSA competition again this year. The students brought back 59 medals from the state competition and another gold chapter of distinction level award, the largest member growth award, and largest chapter in the state award. Students and faculty returned from Nationals with 13 competition medals and another recognition as a National Model of Excellence Chapter. The college's Associate of Science in Nursing is the number one program in the state for successful NCLEX-RN pass rates, and more. The voice that shares these success stories and visuals for the college, the marketing and public relations department, was recognized by the Collegiate Advertising Awards, for being in the top 16% of the nation for collegiate advertising excellence.

Our focus on workforce development by providing skilled and ready employees went to new levels this year with the introduction and expansion of programs. Apprenticeship partnerships grew by 120%.

The creation of a new program called Wiregrass Ready equips students with needed skills for immediate employment. This 2 to 4-week program provides initial training and certification in areas such as OSHA 10-hour general industry certification, forklift operator, HeartSaver/CPR, and other valuable employability skills. Thanks to Guardian Bank and the VSU Small Business Development Center, Wiregrass students and alumni have access to an Entrepreneurship Academy completely free!

The generous giving of individuals and companies led to Wiregrass students receiving more than \$100,000 in foundation scholarships. These scholarships filled the financial gaps many students face when attending college.

As stated in our mission statement, Wiregrass is focused on promoting community, educational and economic development by providing a trained workforce. During our fiscal year from June 2018 to July 2019, the College faculty, staff and students displayed all the work that goes into fulfilling our mission on local, state and national levels. These successes were made possible through the partnerships and relationships the college has formed in the communities we serve. We thank you for those partnerships. We thank you for your support through your time commitment, in-kind donations, and financial giving. Your involvement in what we do is invaluable to the success of each student.

# Wiregrass RN Program Named #1 in the State

According to the Registered Nursing.org website the Associate of Science in Nursing (RN) program at Wiregrass was named the number one program in the state of Georgia for 2019. This ranking is among all colleges, universities and technical colleges. The ranking was based on the students' National Council Licensure Exam (NCLEX-RN) pass rates. According to the Registered Nursing.org site "We have ranked the top 20 nursing schools in Georgia by analyzing current and historical NCLEX-RN "pass rates," meaning the percentage of graduates who passed the exam out of the total 53 RN programs currently offered in the state. Programs reviewed included schools that offer an Associate in Nursing (ADN/ASN), BSN, or Direct-Entry MSN Degree."



Dr. Darlene Ridley, RN, MSN, CNE, Wiregrass' Director of Nursing, has taught since the program began in January of 2014. "The nursing program prepares students throughout the duration of the program. We want our students to achieve success on the National Council Licensure Exam (NCLEX-RN) and to perform proficiently as a competent and safe professional registered nurse. In order to achieve success, students are required to demonstrate competency with clinical skills, drug calculation, and on the HESI final exam each semester," shared Dr. Ridley.

RN program has a job placement rate of **100%** with graduates in many area hospitals, doctor's offices, and nursing facilities.

Dr. Tina K. Anderson, Wiregrass Tech President, shared, "The ASN faculty truly care about the students and are continuously striving to improve the program. Students can be confident that when they successfully complete the program they are prepared to pass the NCLEX-RN. Wiregrass is extremely proud of the faculty, graduates and students. This ranking is further validation of the hard work they put in day after day."

The RN program has a job placement rate of 100% with graduates working in many area hospitals, doctor's offices, and nursing facilities. Eli Metts, BSN, RN, CCRN, graduated from Wiregrass in 2017 with his Associate of Science Degree in Nursing. He is the Nurse Manager in the Invasive Cardiology Unit at South Georgia Media Center Dasher Heart Center. Eli shared this, "I am so glad I chose Wiregrass to pursue my nursing education. Having been in the field for close to two years now, I know that I was more than prepared when I joined the ranks of registered nurses in my community. I learned all the practical skills at Wiregrass that serve me in my job role today. The hands-on experience I garnered as a student from Wiregrass made me feel confident and comfortable when I entered the workforce. To my mind, there is no better choice for prospective nurses when they are deciding on where to pursue their degree." Since graduation he has completed his Bachelors of Science in Nursing and is currently pursuing his masters as a Nurse Practitioner.



## Wiregrass Tech Top in Awards Count for Second Year at SkillsUSA State Championship

Wiregrass Georgia Technical College had an overwhelming showing at the 2019 SkillsUSA State Championship in Atlanta. The college brought back 26 gold, 23 silver, and 10 bronze medals in the skills competition among other colleges. The college medaled in 83% of the contests the students competed in, and 67% of Wiregrass students who competed earned a medal. Among the gold medal count is the Gold Chapter of Distinction level award for the second year in a row. Wiregrass' SkillsUSA Chapter was also recognized for Largest Member Growth and Largest Chapter again this year.

Kelley Wetherington, Campus Life Coordinator and SkillsUSA Advisor, worked hard this year to recruit students for the organization and to help coordinate the service projects that led them to win the gold level Chapter of Distinction award. For the second year in a row, the Wiregrass Chapter was recognized for the largest chapter increase of members (81), and the largest chapter, with 180 members. The Chapter had 89 students compete in 48 contests, and brought home 59 medals. "I am beyond proud of the students and advisors for their dedication, sacrifice, and hard work that they put in this year," shared Wetherington. "Not only did the students put in extra time perfecting their skills for competition, but they also put in extra time helping with several chapter projects in addition to juggling their college and home life." Some of the projects students participated in were "Give our Neighbors a Helping Hand," for hurricane relief; Paladins Wars, an esports gaming competition, "What's in your brand?", how to prepare for job interviews, and Tiaras and Ties, a project to support individuals with special needs attending the Tim Tebow Night to Shine Proms.





# Wiregrass Brings Home 13 National SkillsUSA Competition Medals

- At the 55th Annual SkillsUSA National Leadership and Skills Conference, students earned seven gold medals, four silver, and two bronze.
- Wiregrass students completed in 15 competitions at nationals, including 9 new contests for the college.
- Radiology students ShaDawn Powell (Lake Park), Emily Anderson (Valdosta), and Carson Poindexter (Adel) won a gold medal in Career Pathways (Health Science).
- In the Community Service Competition, Radiology students Jeff Gary (Valdosta), Deric Jackson (Valdosta), and Heather Bennett (Madison, FL) won gold. That's the second year in a row that Wiregrass claimed gold in this category at Nationals.
- Rose Sysskind (Valdosta) won gold for Nurse Assisting.
- Winning a silver medal for the CNC Turning Specialist was John Lake (Valdosta), a Precision Machine and Manufacturing student.
- Radiology students Ginna Chaney (Lake Park), Emilie Hall (Valdosta), and Chris Rampley (Valdosta) won silver in Promotional Bulletin Board. This was the second year in a row the college claimed silver in this category.
- Winning Bronze medals were Jeremy Brantley (Valdosta) and Steven Sauls (Ashburn) in the Interactive App and Video Game Creation.
- The SkillsUSA Chapter of Wiregrass was recognized for the second year in a row as a National Model of Excellence and was among 24 schools across the nation selected in chapter achievements.
- Wiregrass also was selected as one of 8 chapters to represent "personal skills" and participated in several activities during the national conference in recognition of their work including a special dinner with the U.S. Deputy Secretary of Education Mick Zais and Cierra Mitchell from the U. S. Department of Labor, Office of Apprenticeship.
- Chapter projects included: a hurricane relief collection drive, planning and hosting an e-sports gaming competition, and Tiaras and Ties project to support individuals with special needs attending the Night to Shine Prom.



# Wiregrass Awarded National Marketing Awards

Wiregrass was named among the top in the nation in the 2018 Collegiate Advertising Awards program. The Collegiate Advertising Awards (CAA) is an elite program recognizing higher education organizations for excellence in communications, marketing, advertising, and promotions of their schools.

The 2018 CAA program had more than 900 entries from the United States and Canada representing small community colleges to very large colleges and universities.

Submissions were reviewed and by a national panel of industry experts, with a possibility of 100 total points. Participant's entries competed against similar-sized organizations in their specific groups and categories.

Wiregrass' Marketing and Public Relations

team was a gold winner for the FY17 Annual Report. The winning report theme was Navigating, designed by Taylor Powell, Graphic Design and Social Media Specialist. With implementation of the college's Navigate advising portal for students through the Advising and Retention Center (ARC), a "navigation theme" was ideal for the annual report. "The bright colors used in the publications along with the "navigating through college" theme turned into a creative and fun project," shared Lydia Hubert, Director of Marketing and Public Relations. The college was also named a silver winner in the category of Website Design. In January of 2018, the college introduced a brand new website. "The college appointed a website committee that worked with closely with the Webmaster, Mary Ann Garner, for over a year," shared Hubert, "This committee assisted with selecting a color scheme and a user-friendly website layout. The actual transfer of over 1,000 pages onto the new site was a very tedious process," shared Hubert. The website offers students opportunities to submit an online application, request campus tours, research information on different programs, and much more.

Awards were issued for the entries that received top marks from judges placing them in the top 16% of the nation for advertising excellence. Judging criteria included creativity, layout and design, functionality, message effectiveness, production quality, and overall appeal.

Representing all areas of communications, medias, marketing, advertising and promotions, the 2018 Collegiate Advertising Awards program contained some of the best advertising projects, arguably, in the world. "The Collegiate Advertising Awards is pleased to recognize the outstanding creative achievements of Wiregrass Georgia Technical College."

Judges placed them in the **top 16% of the nation** for advertising excellence.



# Women in STEM

## Supporting females on their path to a STEM career

Wiregrass held its first Women in STEM Symposium and Professional Development Day in June. The event reached high school counselors, teachers, and administrators across the 11 counties Wiregrass serves. The purpose of the symposium was to discuss how to keep middle school to high school aged girls engaged in STEM career fields. The symposium kicked off with a field trip to local industries in Valdosta who have women working in STEM related jobs. The attendees were able to see first-hand, many for the first time, what is involved in manufacturing. At each industry the group got to hear from women in the field, how long they had been working there, and what they do each day. The tours helped educators understand the kinds of career fields locally that they can encourage their students, especially females, to learn more about. A panel of local females in STEM related careers shared how they were led into their chosen careers and why. The educators were able to ask questions from the panel to gain insight into the personal interests, obstacles, and paths each one had to take to get where they are today. The keynote speaker was the founder of STEM GEMS, Stephanie Espy. She holds a Chemical Engineering Degree from MIT and UC Berkeley, and has written a book dedicated to women in STEM careers. Espy serves as a speaker who travels around the country encouraging females to consider STEM careers.





# Wiregrass's Dual Enrollment Program

## #1 in Enrollment for Georgia

The Dual Enrollment program for Wiregrass was ranked number one in enrollment for the state for FY19. "Wiregrass Georgia Technical College is honored to share a strong partnership with our area high schools who work tirelessly to promote dual enrollment opportunities for their students. Dual Enrollment is a team effort at Wiregrass, which includes all levels of the college. With the support of our Local Board of Directors, Dr. Anderson, our partners with local school systems, and all those at Wiregrass, we are able to offer this outstanding program to the students and families in our service area," shared Brooke Jaramillo, Executive Director for High School Services. The program served 26 high schools helping students earn over 27,000 college credits during FY19.

Because dual enrollment classes are free, this was a savings to parents of \$4.8 million. The top three high schools served in FY19 were Coffee High School, Fitzgerald High School, and Valdosta High School. The overall success rate with A,B,C grading was 88%. Studies have shown that students who participate in Dual Enrollment courses get a 1.5 boost in their HOPE Scholarship GPA calculation upon graduation from high school.

## GOAL Student



**Nikki Hinson**, a Radiologic Technology student, was named Wiregrass' 2019 Georgia Occupational Award of Leadership (GOAL) winner. A family tragedy first sparked Nikki's interest in the medical field. "My mom was involved in a head-on collision which resulted in breaking most of the bones in her body", shared Nikki. "The event was also my first look into the world of medicine as I watched doctors and techs and all sort of equipment see inside my mother's body to diagnose and treat her." Nikki's mother would eventually recover and Nikki married and became a busy mom with two little boys. As her life was falling into place, she found that she still wanted to return to school.

Nikki enrolled at Wiregrass and through her own research found the program that peaked her interest, Radiologic Technology. Nikki was impressed with the college's guarantee on graduates and knew employers would be intrigued by an applicant that was backed by a two-year guarantee. Once becoming a Wiregrass student, she became an active member of SkillsUSA and served as the college's chapter president. Nikki was a member of the SkillsUSA team that earned gold medals at both state and national levels. She served as Secretary for the Student Government Association. GOAL, a statewide program of the Technical College System of Georgia, honors excellence in academics and leadership among the state's technical college students. Local GOAL winners are selected at each of the state's 22 technical colleges.

Nikki was nominated by her Radiologic Technology Instructor, Jennifer Ray. "I nominated Nikki because she is an exemplary student who not only excels in the Radiologic Technology program, but also demonstrates leadership and decision-making skills through her involvement in various student organizations," shared Ray. Nikki shared, "I am so honored to be our local GOAL winner! I am thankful for the overwhelming support that I have received and for the opportunity to represent



Wiregrass at regionals. This award represents my academic achievements as well as my character, and to be chosen as the student best fit to represent such an incredible technical college is humbling to say the least."

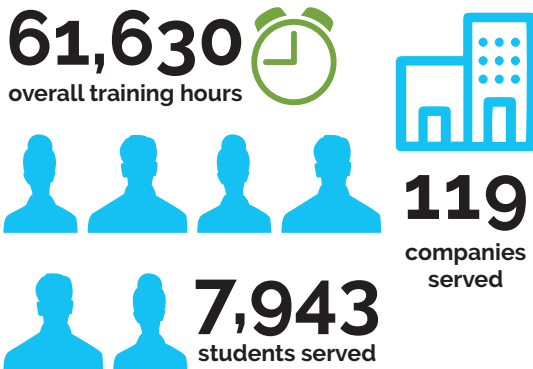


**12** local teachers (representing Pre-K through grade 12 from 9 school districts) earned their professional teaching certificate through the GaTAPP program.

Danielle Wilkerson Adams, a kindergarten teacher from Hahira Elementary School, was the program's representative for the state GaPSC Ambassador program.



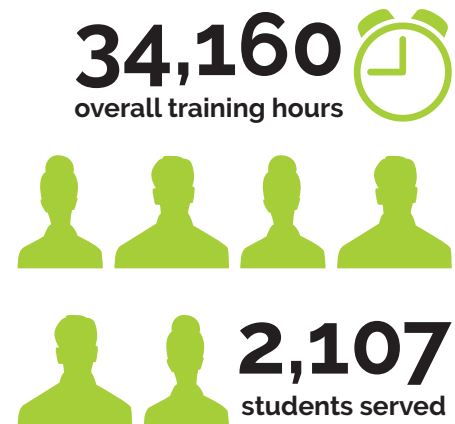

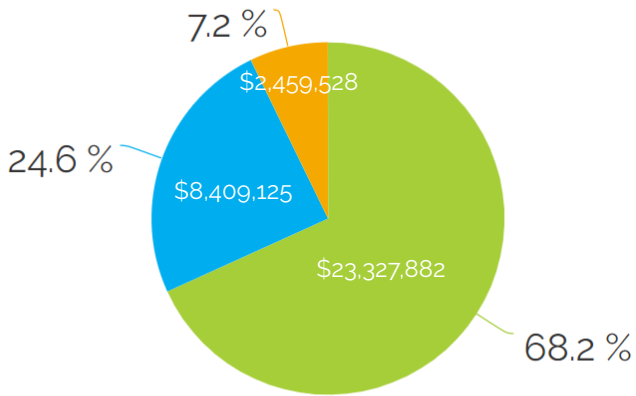

**Expenditures & Reserve**

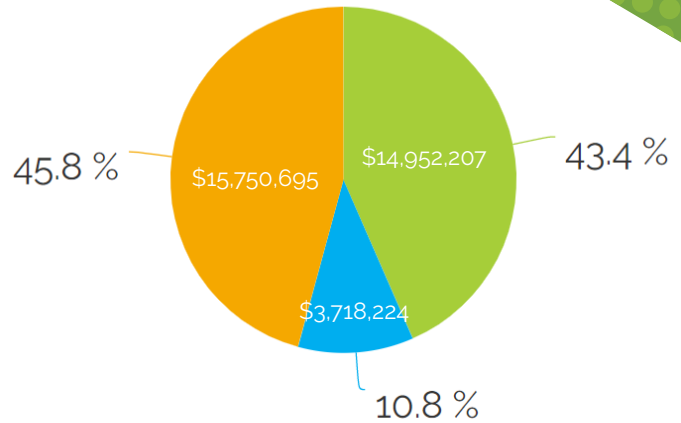


Salaries & Fringes Operations Equipment

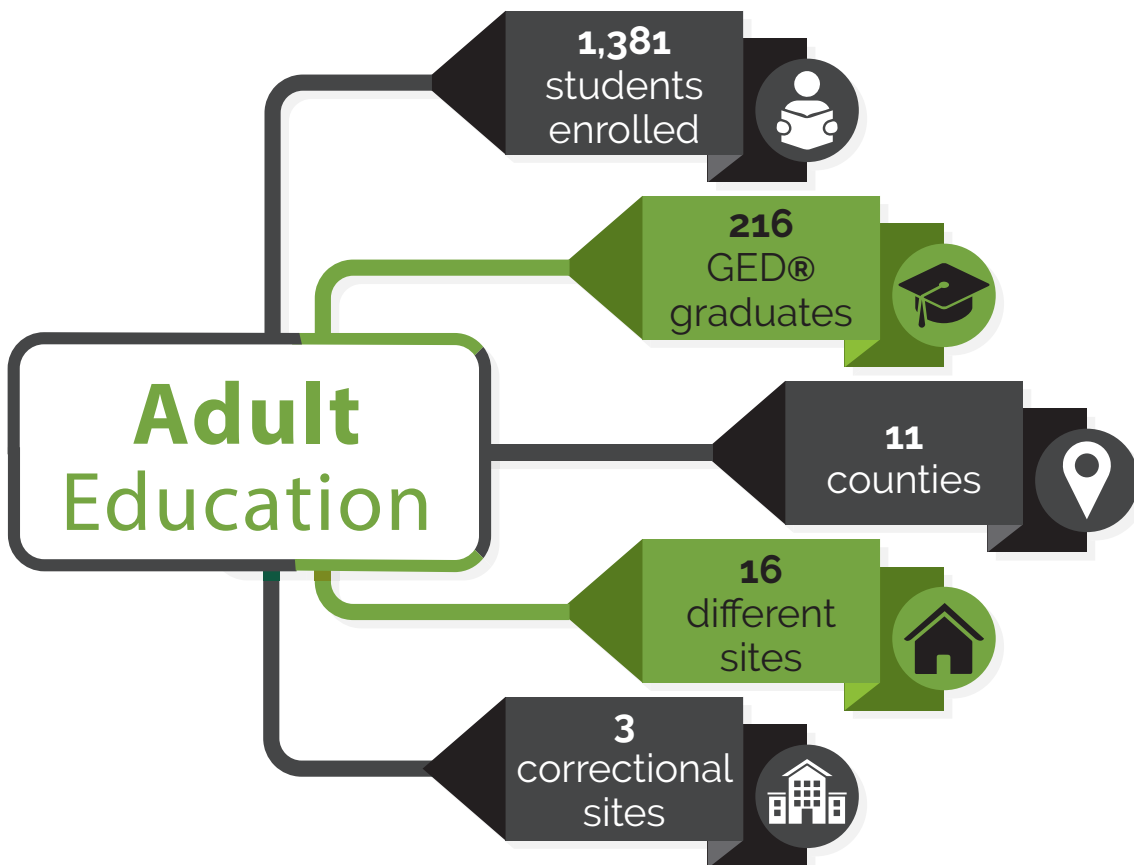

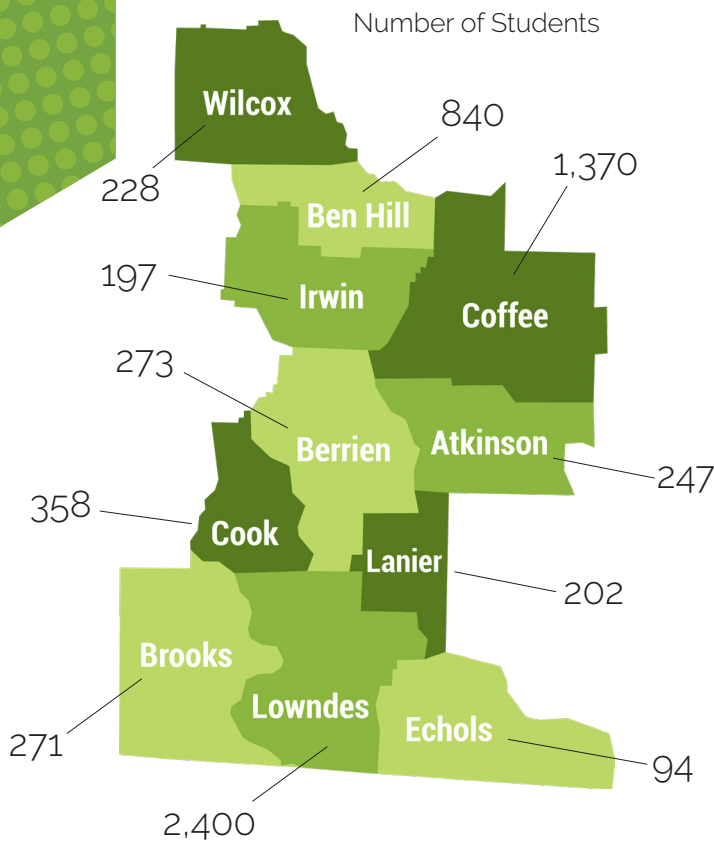

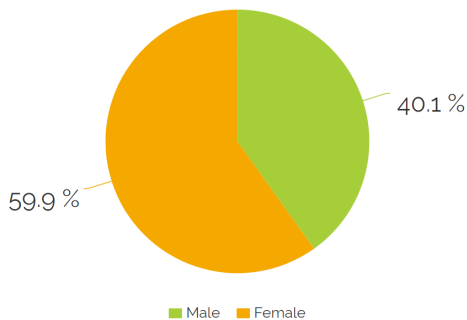

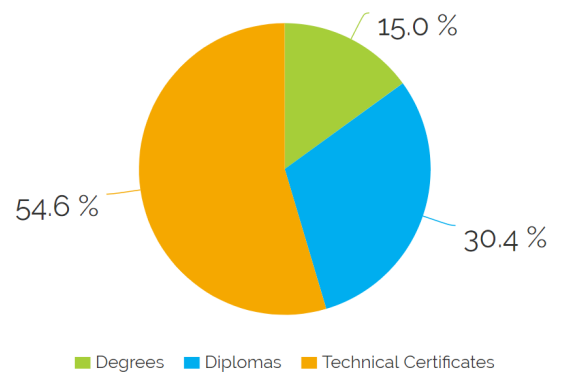

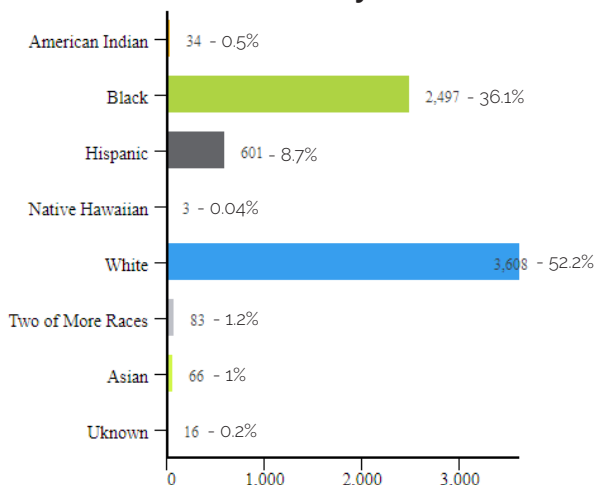
## Enrollment by Gender



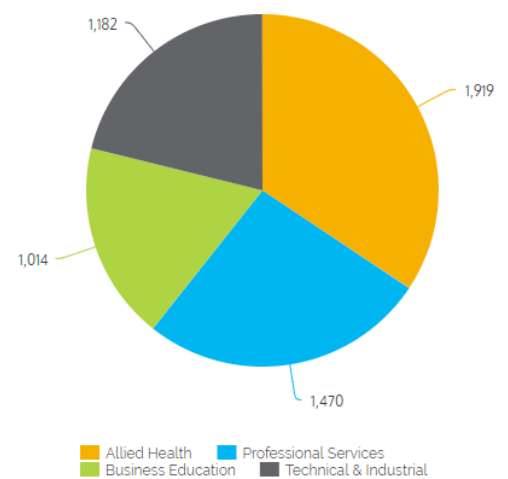
## Graduates by Program Type

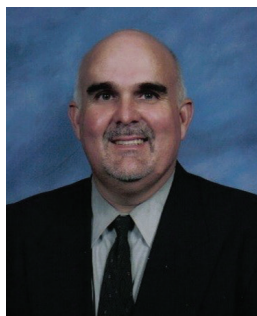

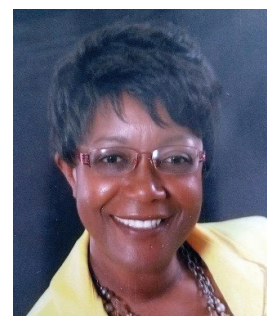
